

M.C. PERRY HIGH SCHOOL RULES AND PROCEDURES

GRADUATION

Students must maintain a 2.0 and earn 26 Carnegie units for graduation.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

All schedule change requests must be completed by 13 September. As per DODEA policy September 13th is the cut off date to drop or add a class.

ATTENDANCE

Sponsors are expected to call the main office when their child is absent. Absence from school will be considered unexcused until a signed note from a parent is received in the main office on the day following the absence. The letter should include:

Student's name, Date of absence/tardy, Reason for absence/tardy and Signature of Parent/Guardian Sponsor.

Students are not permitted to make up assignments and/or tests for unexcused absences.

DETENTION

Any Perry High School faculty member may assign detention. In addition, Saturday school will be held at least monthly.

DRESS CODE

Students are expected to adhere to the base wide dress code. Examples of the types of clothing considered inappropriate are tank tops, muscle shirts, shirts that have sleeves removed, shirts which expose the midriff or chest area, any clothing with spaghetti straps (2 inch minimums for shirt sleeves), see through clothing, excessively baggy pants, pants worn too low or without a belt, short shorts (above the fingertips when standing) and shower type flip-flop shoes or plastic type shoes. These examples are not all inclusive. The principal and assistant principal will have the final authority to determine if clothing or footwear is acceptable. Refusal to comply with the dress code policy will result in parent notification and possibly suspension.

ELEVATOR

Students are not permitted to use the elevator unless they are unable to use the stairs and have office approval.

SIGN IN/OUT PROCEDURES

Students who leave the building between 0750 and 1430, except during lunch for grades 9-12, are required to be signed out by their parent/guardian in the main office. Failure to sign out is considered skipping.

LOCKERS

Student lockers are government property and may be searched without consent at any time.

SCHOOL RULES

1. Eating and drinking are not permitted in common areas other than the cafeteria.
2. Public Displays of Affection, beyond hand holding, is not acceptable.
3. Horseplay, play fighting, and scuffling will result in a disciplinary action.
4. All electronic devices, including music player, cell phones, cameras, beepers are NOT to be used in the school. **An exception is students on campus for lunch may use electronic games or iPod type devices.** Students bringing these items to school do so at their own risk. If visible in school, they will be confiscated and returned only to a parent or guardian. Electronic devices confiscated for the 2nd time will not be returned to the parent until the last day of school.
5. Head coverings (hats, scarves, headbands, etc.) are unacceptable and will be confiscated and returned to sponsor.
6. Bikes, skateboards, and scooters are not to be used on school ground.
7. Bringing a weapon or REPLICA weapon is a serious disciplinary offense and will result in a serious consequence, such as expulsion.

TEXTBOOKS

Textbooks are furnished by M.C. Perry School for students use. Any lost or damaged books will be charged to the student. Students who lose a textbook please ensure the replacement book is mailed to: MC Perry High School

MEDICATIONS

Medications are ONLY to be administered at school through the school nurse. This includes Tylenol, aspirin, cough syrup and over the counter medications. Asthmatics needing their inhaler on their person need medical documentation and confirm with administration.

LUNCH

Lunch will occur for all students from 1215 to 1300. All 7th and 8th grade students must remain on campus during lunch. 9th – 12th grade may leave campus. During lunch hours, students are to remain in the cafeteria until 1230. At 1230, students may use the gym, courtyard, Information Center, and outside basketball court. Students are NOT permitted in the buildings, on the elementary school playground equipment, or in any area not listed.

ELIGIBILITY

To play sports or be involved in extracurricular activities, students must maintain a 2.0 GPA and have no more that 1 "F" grade. Eligibility is checked on Tuesdays at 1630. Any student who is found ineligible will not travel with their team and must complete academic interventions with their coach or sponsor.

TARDINESS

Students are expected to be in class on time. Tardy consequences are as follows:

- 3 = 60 minutes of Monday Detention
- 4 = 120 minutes of Monday Detention
- 5 = Saturday School
- 6+ = 1 day suspension for each tardy
